Library Chairperson's Report

Calls for the banning of books and restrictions on intellectual freedom dominated the world of libraries in 2023. Dr. Lucy Santos Green, during her presentation for the MB Library Conference, focused on the moral panic that has been disrupting the normal delivery of library services in many parts of the United States and Canada. Her compelling words coupled with the Public Libraries' Intellectual Freedom and Anti-Censorship Toolkit provided us with guidelines and will to create a strong policy to deal with any challenges to our local system.

In addition to the work required to deal with potential requests to remove or restrict materials, our library system learned about the new funding formula that was proposed and, later, adopted.

Apart from these two changes, our library system continued to provide materials, services and programs for our patrons. Our talented staff worked together to ensure that all were well served. I would like to highlight a posting, on social media, made by the MB Library Association. Our Library Administrator, Krista Law, was recognized for her volunteer work with MLA's Prison Libraries Committee. Congratulations, Krista and thank you for this valuable work!

The Lakeland Regional Library is well served by our staff. Their dedication to our system is well known and well regarded by the citizens they serve.

I would like to thank the staff and my fellow board members for their dedication and support of our system and its patrons.



As things return to the new normal post pandemic, we have really seen a lot more people attend our programs and want to create partnerships with the library. We have had a huge increase in attendance at programs (36% over 2022) which is wonderful to see. We also saw more and more attendance as the year went on. We want to be relevant to the community so seeing these increases is gratifying.

We've also increased our partnerships both in number and in depth. We are working more with community groups like Services for Seniors and Killarney School, while adding partnerships like the Cartwright Daycare. We've done a lot of outreach this year about our services and is seems to be paying off.


Existing Facility, Programs & Services Return on investment 2023 = 346%
